Rajyotsava award



News -

- On the occasion of the Kannada Rajyotsava celebrations on November 1, the State government on Thursday announced its annual Rajyotsava awards for 70 personalities for their contributions in different fields.

Kannada Rajyotsava Award

- It is also known as the Rajyotsava Prashasti.
- It is the second-highest civilian honor presented by the Government of Karnataka.
- It is awarded annually on November 1st, which marks Kannada Rajyotsava—the anniversary of the formation of Karnataka state in 1956 through the unification of Kannada-speaking regions
- The award carries an amount of ₹5 lakh, a 25-gram gold medal, and a citation.

State water commission

News -

- **State govt. planning to set up permanent water commission**

State water commission

- **Karnataka is planning to establish a permanent water commission** comprising technical experts **on the lines of the Central Water Commission,**
- **Purpose-** to recommend to the State government **measures on water security and on matters of water disputes.** It will also assess demand and availability of water in the State, and fix responsibility on farmers for its usage.

Composition -

- The commission will have **10 to 15 technical experts.**
- It will have representatives from the Irrigation and the Finance Departments, experts from the field of environmental science and water resources, and progressive farmers, among others.

Karnataka bags award for highest under-construction wind capacity

News -

- **Karnataka has won the national award for having the highest under-construction wind capacity in 2024-25.**
- The recognition was presented during the **seventh edition of Windergy India 2025,** the country's flagship wind energy event held in Chennai.

Additional information - Wind Energy Sector in India: Status

- **Wind Power Capacity:** India has the **4th largest installed wind power capacity in the world.**
- **Installed Capacity:** As of **51.67 GW as of August 12, 2025.**
- **Highest wind energy producing states - Gujarat followed by Tamil Nadu and Karnataka & Rajasthan.**

Government Initiatives for the Wind Sector

- **National Wind-Solar Hybrid Policy (2018):** Encourages combining wind and solar in one project to ensure continuous power supply and efficient land use.
- **Offshore Wind Policy (2015):** Provides framework for developing offshore wind

farms in Indian waters, including permissions and grid planning.

SWR launches 'MUTS Sahayak' ticketing scheme



News

- In a bid to streamline the ticketing process, **South Western Railway (SWR)** has launched the **Mobile Unreserved Ticketing System (MUTS) Sahayak Scheme** at the KSR Bengaluru Station.
- This makes SWR the **first railway zone** in the country to introduce the initiative.

Mobile Unreserved Ticketing System (MUTS) Sahayak Scheme

- Under the scheme, trained **MUTS Sahayaks** will use **MUTS handheld devices** to issue **unreserved tickets to passengers.**
- The move is aimed at **easing congestion at ticket counters and providing commuters with a quicker, hassle-free option for purchasing tickets.**

Honnavar Port Project

News -

- Fact-finding report asks State to revoke environmental clearance

Honnavar Port Project

- **Location:** Honnavara (Honnavar), Uttara Kannada district, Karnataka, at the mouth of the Sharavathi River.
- **Project type:** Major **deep-water port development** under public-private partnership; **managed by Honnavar Port Private Limited (HPPL)** in collaboration with Karnataka Maritime Board.
- **Project cost:** Approximately ₹607 crore.

- **Cargo handling:** Initial capacity of 4.9 million tonnes per annum (MTPA), expected to boost regional maritime trade and economic growth.
- **Opposition:** Strong resistance from local fishing communities across five villages due to threats to livelihoods and ecological concerns related to the Sharavathi estuary.

Cobra Beat



News -

- In a bid to tackle micro-level issues contributing to traffic congestion, the Bengaluru Traffic Police (BTP) has launched a Cobra Beat system.

Cobra Beat system

- It is a traffic management initiative by the Bengaluru Traffic Police
- **Overview** - to address congestion by having designated officers, known as "Cobras," patrol specific routes during peak hours to tackle issues like illegal parking, bottlenecks, and wrong-way driving.
- These officers act as first responders to proactively resolve minor traffic problems that cause major jams, improving real-time traffic flow.

Chief Minister's Kaushalya Karnataka Yojane (CMKKY)



News -

- **Chief Minister's Kaushalya Karnataka Yojane (CMKKY) shall be targeted under schemes implemented directly by SDEL**
- **2.50 lakh youth shall be targeted under schemes implemented by other Government departments and government bodies.**

Chief Minister's Kaushalya Karnataka Yojane (CMKKY)

- **Aim-** It is the flagship skill development scheme by the Government of Karnataka, providing free, short-term vocational training to the state's youth to enhance their employability and promote entrepreneurship.

Key Features and Objectives

- **Goal:** The scheme aims to skill 5 lakh youth annually across various government departments to meet industry demands.
- **Target Audience:** It is designed for youth, especially school drop-outs and existing workers in the informal sector, within an general age group of 15 to 35 years (with some exceptions for specific categories).
- **Training Areas:** Training is offered in nearly 3,000 job roles across over 35 sectors, including IT & ITeS, healthcare, automotive, electronics, and agriculture. Recent updates for 2025-26 prioritize emerging areas like Artificial Intelligence and Blockchain.
- **Placement Assistance:** The Karnataka Skill Development Corporation (KSDC), which oversees the program, also facilitates placement opportunities for at least 70% of the trainees after successful completion of the course.

- **Integration with other schemes:** CMKKY works in convergence with central government schemes like the **Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) and the state's recent "Yuvanidhi Plus" initiative** for beneficiaries receiving unemployment allowances.

Bengaluru Skill Summit 2025



News-

- **The Bengaluru Skill Summit 2025 was held from November 4 to 6, 2025.**
- **Theme : "Workforce 2030: Scale, Systems, and Synergy."**

Organizers and Partners

- The summit was organized by the **Government of Karnataka** through the **Skill Development Entrepreneurship and Livelihood Department**, along with the **Karnataka Skill Development Corporation, Department of Agriculture, and Karnataka Digital Economy Mission.**

Objectives and Vision

- to strengthen institutions, build a robust ecosystem for traditional and emerging skills, improve the quality and inclusivity of skilling, and foster innovation and global workforce mobility.
- **Karnataka aims to be the "Skill Gateway to the World"** by aligning with international certification standards and vocational education frameworks.

Sugar Production in India

- **India became the world's top sugar producer in 2021-2022, surpassing Brazil.**
- **Location of Sugar Industry in India:** Sugar industry is broadly distributed over two major areas of production:
 1. **Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Haryana and Punjab in the north and**
 2. **Maharashtra, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh in the south.**

Sugarcane - Uses

- **It belongs to the bamboo family of plants and is indigenous to India.**
- **About two-third of the total sugarcane produced in India is consumed for making gur and khandsari and only one-third of it goes to sugar factories.**
- **It also provides raw material for manufacturing alcohol.**
- **Bagasse, the crushed cane residue, can be more beneficially used for manufacturing paper.**
- **Ethanol production** - It is also an efficient substitute for petroleum products and a host of other chemical products.
- **India has become the 3rd largest country in the world in ethanol production after the USA and Brazil.**

Conditions for growth

- **Crop duration: 10-15 months, and even 18 months** to mature, depending upon geographical conditions.
- **Soil: Sugarcane can tolerate any kind of soil that can retain moisture. Examples - loams, clayey, black cotton soil, brown or reddish loam and laterites.**
- It should be **rich in nitrogen, calcium and phosphorus.**
- **Climate: Hot and Humid (21-27 °C of temperature and 75-150 cm of rainfall).**

Government steps

Fair and Remunerative Price (FRP) of sugarcane

- **Recommended by** - Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP)
- **Objective** - to assure margins on account of profit and risk to farmers, irrespective of the fact whether sugar mills generate profit or not.

Tenth-century inscription dating to Ganga dynasty reign found on outskirts of Mysuru



News -

- A 10th-century inscription from the Ganga dynasty reign has been found inside the Mahalingeshwara Temple at Nadanahalli on the outskirts of Mysuru.
- It is a Kannada inscription dating back to the time of Butuga II, a ruler from the Ganga dynasty in 948 A.D.
- It is believed that during the reign of Butuga II, his bodyguard, Maremma, may have donated the garden to the temple tax-free and entrusted its management to the village chief Vijaketa Gavunda.

News -

- Cabinet approves policy to help set up 25,000 start-ups in five years

Karnataka Startup Policy 2025-30

- Policy aims to ensure that at least 10,000 of the targeted 25,000 start-ups are set up outside Bengaluru.

Vision

- To position the state as a global innovation hub, fostering a vibrant and supportive ecosystem for nurturing startups throughout their lifecycle.
- To provide **resources, mentorship, and infrastructure** desired to drive sustainable growth and technological advancements.

Mission

- Through this policy Karnataka seeks to establish up to **25,000 additional startups, out of which up to 10,000 startups emerging from clusters Beyond Bengaluru.** By expanding the entrepreneurial footprints, the initiative helps the state to enhance its role as a leading innovation hub.
- **Expand innovation hubs, incubation centers, and co-working spaces** to support entrepreneurs across different regions.
- Strengthen **international collaborations, trade partnerships, and global networking opportunities** for startups to expand their reach.

Resource Mobilisation Committee (RMC) report

Major recommendations of Resource Mobilisation Committee report



News -

- The Resource Mobilisation Committee (RMC) of Karnataka submitted its report in November 2025 recommending comprehensive reforms to boost the state's revenue.

The Resource Mobilisation Committee (RMC) of Karnataka,

- **Formed in** - August- 2024
- **Headed by** - The committee headed by retired IAS officer K.P. Krishnan

- **Mandate** - It is a government-appointed body recommending comprehensive reforms to boost the state's revenue.

Key recommendations

- **Increase and rationalize user charges:** Rationalize and increase user charges for government services and utilities, transitioning to volumetric billing with automatic inflation indexation.
- **Tax reforms:** Restructure the tax regime to **broaden the tax base** and reduce the state's dependence on a few sources like commercial taxes and **excise duties**.
- **Modernize the excise system:** Introduce auction-based **digital licensing to enhance transparency and efficiency in the excise sector**.
- **Asset monetization:** Unlock the value of government assets through scientific valuation and leasing under public-private partnerships.
- **Strengthen asset management:** Improve asset data management and conduct systematic surveys of government properties.
- **Create an economic policy wing:** Establish a new wing within the finance department to monitor non-tax revenues and oversee asset monetization initiatives.
- **Urban land monetisation** among steps to shore up revenues

News -

- **Krishi Mela 2025** was conducted by the **University of Agricultural Sciences-Bangalore** from November 13 to 16 on the GKVK campus in Bengaluru.
- **2025 theme 'Prosperous Agriculture - Viksit Bharat: Soil, Water, and Crop'**,

Domestic Workers (Social Security and Welfare) Bill, 2025

News -

- The Karnataka Domestic Workers' Rights Union has urged the State government to **strengthen the proposed Domestic Workers (Social Security and Welfare) Bill, 2025**,

The Domestic Workers (Social Security and Welfare) Bill, 2025

- **Aim** - It is aimed at formalizing the domestic work sector and providing social security and welfare benefits to an estimated 15 lakh (1.5 million) domestic workers.

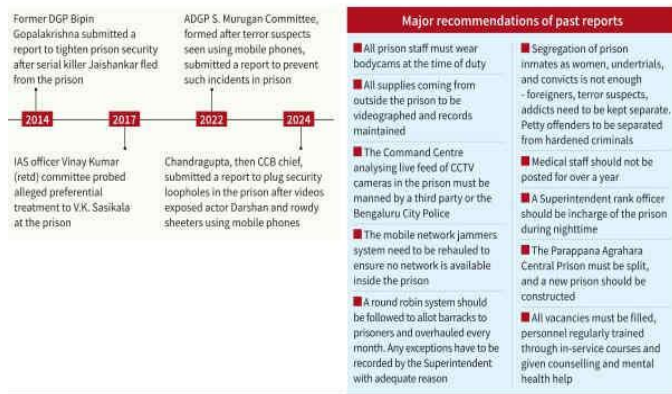
Key Provisions of the Draft Bill

- **Mandatory Registration:** Both domestic workers and their employers (including households, agencies, and digital platforms) are required to register on a government portal.
- **Written Employment Agreements:** Employers must provide a written contract specifying wages, working hours, benefits, and conditions of work. Unregistered employment is considered illegal.
- **Minimum Wages and Working Hours:** Workers are entitled to a minimum wage, with a cap of 48 working hours per week, overtime pay, rest periods, and weekly holidays.
- **Social Security and Welfare Board:** The bill provides for the creation of a **Karnataka State Domestic Workers Social Security and Welfare Board** to manage a dedicated fund. This fund would provide benefits such as health insurance, maternity/paternity benefits, pension, accident compensation, and education support for children.

- **Penalties: Non-compliance can result in fines and imprisonment for employers or agencies.** Severe offenses like child labor or human trafficking carry stricter penalties (up to 7 years imprisonment and a ₹50,000 fine).
- **Grievance Redressal: District-level committees** are proposed to resolve disputes between workers and employers.

High-powered committee formed to review functioning of prisons in State

Reports submitted in the past following incidents at City Central Prison



News-

- A high-powered committee has been constituted to **review the functioning, administration, and security of prisons across Karnataka**, following reports of illegal activities and preferential treatment at the Parappana Agrahara Central Prison.
- A high-powered committee would be **led by Additional Director-General of Police (Law and Order) Hitendra**, with Inspector-General of Police **Sandeep Patil**, Superintendents of Police **Amarnath Reddy** and **Rishyanth**, as members.

Karnataka records 24% drop in maternal deaths

News -

- Karnataka has recorded a **24% reduction in maternal deaths this year — from January to October** — compared to the corresponding period in 2024.
- The Health Department had launched the **“Mission Zero Preventable Maternal Deaths”** initiative.

Mission Zero Preventable Maternal Deaths

- It is an initiative launched by the state of Karnataka, India
- **Objective - to reduce its maternal mortality rate (MMR).**
- **Maternal mortality ratio (MMR) for Karnataka is 68 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births**, as per the Sample Registration System (SRS) Special Bulletin for 2021-2023.
- The mission aims to **eliminate all preventable maternal deaths by enhancing healthcare infrastructure, services, and monitoring.**

Key Components of the Initiative

- The initiative, also integrated into India's national **Surakshit Matritva Aashwasan (SUMAN) program**, focuses on a multi-pronged strategy to **ensure quality and accessible care.**
- **Infrastructure and Resource Rationalization:** The plan involves strengthening all 147 taluk hospitals and 42 well-performing community health centers (CHCs) to provide 24/7 comprehensive emergency obstetric and newborn care (CEmONC) services.
- **Targeting High-Risk Pregnancies:** A significant portion of maternal deaths (an estimated 70% in Karnataka) are considered preventable. The mission emphasizes the identification and rigorous tracking of high-risk pregnancies, ensuring timely intervention for complications like hemorrhage, hypertensive disorders, and anemia.
- **Financial and Nutritional Support:** The initiative includes provisions for nutritional kits and cash incentives for pregnant and lactating women from low socioeconomic backgrounds.

“Koti Vruksha Abhiyan”

- **“Koti Vruksha Abhiyan”** has pushed up the forest cover of Vijayapura district.

“Koti Vruksha Abhiyan” (One Crore Tree Campaign)

- It is a **large-scale tree plantation initiative** primarily associated with **Vijayapura**,

Karnataka, aimed at transforming the district's arid landscape.

- **Launched in 2015 by Minister M. B. Patil.**
- The program has successfully **planted over 15 million trees by encouraging community participation through subsidized saplings**
- This effort has **significantly increased the district's forest cover, revived ecosystems, brought back wildlife, and inspired other regions.**

CM inaugurates Kalaloka store at KIA

News -

- **The Kalaloka store, which will showcase and sell Karnataka's traditional and GI-certified products to both domestic and international travellers at the Kempegowda International Airport (KIA).**
- **The Kalaloka store, which has been aesthetically designed to reflect the State's culture and heritage, has been set up by the Department of Industries at Terminal 2.**
- **It features Karnataka's traditional products such as Mysore Sandal Soap, sandalwood oil, incense sticks, Mysuru Silk, Channapatna toys, LIDKAR leather goods, aromatic coffee powders and beverages, handloom products, Ilkal sarees, Lambani garments, sandalwood artefacts, Bidriware, and Mysore-style paintings.**
- **"In total, 45 GI-certified products from Karnataka will be showcased and sold here,"**

State ranks fourth in country in terms of adoption numbers

News -

- **Maharashtra tops the list; despite growing interest, Karnataka faces a shortage of adoptable children**
- **Karnataka ranks fourth in the country in terms of adoption numbers, following Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, and West Bengal, according to data shared by officials from the Directorate of Child Protection.**

Additional Information - Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA)

- **Legal status** - It has been set up as a statutory body of the Ministry of Women and Child Development.
- It functions as a **nodal body for the adoption of Indian children** and is mandated to **monitor and regulate in-country and inter-country adoption.**
- **Following convention** - It is designated as the **Central Authority to deal with Hague Conventions on Inter-Country Adoptions, 1993, ratified by the Government of India in 2003.**

CARINGS (Child Adoption Resource Information and Guidance System) Portal

- **Launched in - 2011.**
- It serves as the sole platform for adoption, complying with the Hague Convention, international protocols, and national laws.

- **The Dr. Sapna S committee was appointed by the Karnataka government to study and recommend menstrual leave policy**
- **Significance** - It aims to create a **more inclusive and stigma-free workplace** and is considered a landmark decision in India, as it covers both government and private sectors comprehensively.

State govt. notifies menstrual leave policy with a day's off a month

Key features -

- Women between **18 and 52** are eligible to seek menstrual leave, and it will be applicable for permanent, contract or outsourced workforce.
- The policy will be applicable to the workforce employed in establishments registered under the **Factories Act, 1948; the Karnataka Shops and Establishments Act, 1961; the Plantation Workers Act 1951; the Beedi and Cigar Workers (Conditions of Employment) Act, 1966, and the Motor Transport Workers Act, 1961.**
- The Government Order (GO) **does not specify anything on leaves for government employees or anganwadi workers or Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs).**
- As per the conditions imposed in the GO, **there will be no provision to carry over the leave to the next month and women**

are not mandated to provide any medical certificate

Sanmitra initiative

News -

- The Karnataka State Police Department has rolled out 'Sanmitra' (a good friend).

Sanmitra initiative

- It is an initiative aimed at providing sustained support, rehabilitation, and monitoring for individuals struggling with substance abuse.
- The programme seeks to address the issue not just through enforcement, but with empathy, guidance and structured rehabilitation
- Under the initiative, every police station across the State will establish a dedicated Sanmitra helpdesk.
- Police personnel designated under Sanmitra must maintain constant contact with affected individuals, engage with their families, and coordinate with mental health professionals to track monthly progress.
- Station heads must collect progress reports from Sanmitra personnel every two weeks and submit confidential monthly reports to the respective SP or DCP in sealed covers.

Fishermen's Distress Relief Fund

News -

- In a bid to strengthen the State's fisheries sector, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah

announced that the compensation under the Fishermen's Distress Relief Fund had been increased from ₹6 lakh to ₹10 lakh.

- Karnataka produced 9.63 lakh tonnes of fish in 2024-25, ranking third in total fish production nationwide.

Fishermen's Distress Relief Fund

- **Purpose:** To provide immediate financial relief and support to fishermen and their families in distress due to accidents, natural calamities, or death while at sea or on land.
- **Administering Authority:** The Department of Animal Husbandry and Fisheries, Government of Karnataka.
- **Compensation Amount:** The compensation amount for the family of a missing or deceased fisherman while at sea has recently been increased from ₹6 lakh to ₹10 lakh in Karnataka.
- **Eligibility:** The applicant must be a registered fisherman/fisherwoman with the department and meet specific criteria depending on the nature of the claim (e.g., loss of life, damage to vessel/gear).

Two menhirs believed to be from late megalithic period found



News -

- In recent archaeological explorations conducted by the Adima Kala Trust (R.) of Udupi in Kundapur region, two menhirs were found at Hilkod situated on the Neralekatte-Ajri Road and at Mavinakere in Kenchanur village in Udupi district.
- The two menhirs, also called nilskals or free standing stones, were from the late megalithic period.

- The nilskal of Mavinakere is about 112 cm in height and is slightly leaning towards the north-west direction.
- The Hilkod nilskal is about 135 cm in height..

Karnataka Rights of Persons with Disabilities bill 2025.

News -

Karnataka moves to expand disability rights with new quota

- The State government has released a draft of the Karnataka Rights of Persons with Disabilities in Employment and Education Bill, 2025, **proposing 5% reservation for persons with disabilities in all private establishments with 20 or more employees.**
- The **draft also mandates that educational institutions earmark 10% of seats in every course for students with disabilities, one of the most expansive attempts** to overhaul inclusion in employment and in higher education.
- The draft sets out a phased introduction of the **5% job quota across the private sector.**
- Companies must distribute these posts across disability categories based on a formula prescribed by the proposed State regulatory authority, file annual compliance reports, and can carry forward unfilled posts for up to three recruitment cycles.
- **Exemptions will be granted** only when essential job functions cannot be performed even with reasonable accommodation.
- **For education**, the Bill makes 10% reservation course-specific, not institution-level, preventing colleges from averaging seats across programmes.

Megalithic excavations in Chamarajanagar district reveal rare burial practices, rock art

- Recent excavations at Doddalathur in Chamarajanagar district have revealed new **insights into early megalithic burial culture and traditions in southern Karnataka, including unusual layouts and rare engravings on boulders.**

- Doddalathur, located in Hanur taluk and five kilometres southwest of Kowdalli, is **one of the few surviving megalithic landscapes in the region where a large number of burials remain intact.**
- **the excavation – found 13 burials**, comprising stone **circles and cairn circles**, constructed with natural boulders of varying diameters.
 - ❖ **Four contained cists, or stone-slab chambers**, while the **rest were urn burials.**
- “In the megalithic burials, the usual burial repertoire includes pottery known as **black-and-red ware, black ware and red ware, and iron objects.** “These were also found in some of the burials that were excavated at Doddalathur,
- in addition to **skeletal and animal remains and a few beads have also been found**
- The most interesting discovery, according to researchers, is that of an **iron object, which is circular in shape with two loops on either sides and resembles an iron shield.**
 - ❖ This was found in **association with iron weapons like axe, arrow, and a two-pronged sword while the same burial has human figures engraved on the boulders. Underlining its importance,**
 - ❖ this is significant because rock art is rare in this part of Karnataka.
- **Charcoal samples from both urn and cist contexts were dated through AMS Carbon-14 analysis, placing the burials between the 6th century BCE and the 4th century CE**, a timeframe consistent with **megalithic occupation** phases elsewhere in peninsular India

Saalumarada Thimmakka



Why in news

- **Padma Shri awardee and environmental icon Saalumarada Thimmakka, renowned for planting 385 banyan trees, passed away at the age of 114 in Bengaluru.**

Biographical Details

- **Full Name:** Saalumarada Thimmakka (born as Thimmakka).
- **Titles:** She is widely known as "**Vriksha Mathe**" (Mother of Trees) and "**Saalumarada Thimmakka**".
- **Birthplace:** She was born in **Gubbi Taluk, Tumakuru District, Karnataka.**
- **Environmental work:** Her environmental work is centered around **Hulikal Village, Magadi Taluk, Ramanagara District.**
- **Spouse:** She was married to **Bikkala Chikkayya**, who was her partner in planting trees until his death in 1991.
- **Lifespan:** She passed away on **November 14, 2025**, at the approximate age of **114 years.**

The Environmental Achievements

- **Tree Species:** She primarily planted **Banyan trees** (Scientific Name: *Ficus benghalensis*).
- **Location:** The trees were planted along a 4 to 4.5 km kilometer stretch of State Highway 94 (**SH-94**) between Hulikal and Kudur.
- **Number of Trees:** She planted **385 banyan trees** in this specific row.
- **Total Contribution:** It is estimated she planted over **8,000 trees** in total during her lifetime.
- **Methodology:** She used **thorny shrubs** to fence the saplings and carried water pots for **4 kilometers** daily.

Major Awards & Recognitions

- **Cabinet Rank (2022):** The Karnataka Government appointed her as the "**Environment Ambassador**" with the status of a Cabinet Minister.
- **Padma Shri (2019):** She received India's fourth-highest civilian award from President Ram Nath Kovind.

- **Nadoja Award (2010):** She received this prestigious honor from **Kannada University, Hampi.**
- **National Citizen's Award (1995):** She was honored by the Government of India for her grassroots work.
- **Indira Priyadarshini Vrikshamitra Award (1997):** She received this national award specifically for contributions to afforestation.
- **International Honor:** An environmental organization in **Los Angeles, USA**, is named "**Thimmakka's Resources for Environmental Education**".
